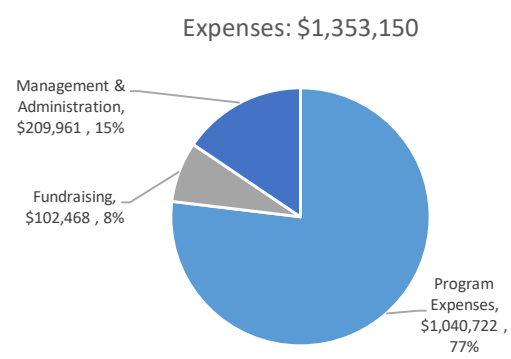
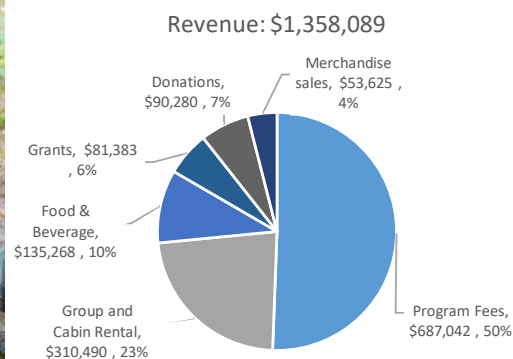
PROGRAM SUMMARY & ANNUAL HIGHLIGHTS

2019 was a year of successful programs bookended by our Spring and Fall Stewardship weekends and filled with bright and memorable weeks of summer camp. Artisan Camp, a new program in 2019, was small but mighty, and participants learned a variety of new skills such as glasswork, carpentry, watercolor painting, knife-making, and photography basics. Welcome the Salmon Home marked the end of summer and the beginning of fall with a rainy day and delicious baked salmon, bringing the community together for a day at Westwind. Fall Family Camp and our annual Mushroom Camp were fall program highlights, featuring our biggest groups for those programs so far. 2019 was a busy year for programs at Westwind, but a smooth and joyful year - a sentiment that we are all eager to return to in 2021.

Channeling the grit and determination of Uncle Bliss, Westwind's original caretaker, our site staff embarked on a journey to remodel the Alpine unit cabins. Tyee, Klickitat and Uncle Bliss were down to their bare bones and then completely remodeled. With the help of countless volunteers who dedicated their time and experience, this project illuminated just how committed the Westwind community is to preserving her greatness for generations to come. We owe a huge thanks to Weitzer Company for donated materials for this project. We also want to acknowledge Angie Wright and her crew of eager and willing high school woodshop students, who designed and built stylish bunkbeds, putting the finishing touch on what are now the most comfortable and welcoming cabins in all of camp. This project was as a shining example of what can be accomplished with patience, teamwork and dedication!

Westwind hosted over 18 guest groups over the course of the year, with many new to Westwind, from local schools to a passionate group of birders to several small family weddings. 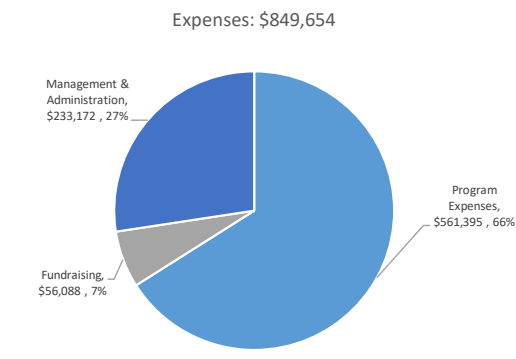
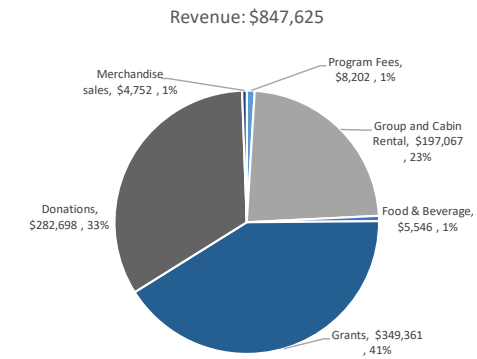
Despite the cancellation of summer camp, outdoor school, and the majority of our scheduled programs, we persevered. In an effort to ensure a lasting future for Westwind, and with a commitment to our mission, by offering a new rental opportunity for families in the era of social distancing, Westwind was able to continue to be a place of rest, reflection, and connection for over one thousand children and families over the course of the summer and fall. While this is only a fifth of our usual visitorship we were incredibly appreciative and proud to be able to offer this safe and enjoyable opportunity for families.

With modifications and changes to our regular programming, we even hosted our annual Mushroom Camp, an educational workshop which provided foraging and other learning opportunities for a small group of individuals who were able to participate this year.

PHILANTHROPY IN ACTION

With the help of over 782 individual donors and local funders, we successfully raised over \$332,633 for the Westwind Recovery Fund in 2020. We also had a lot of fun doing it! Thank you to all who participated in events like the Virtual Campfire, Songs for the Wild, and the Westwind Moves! Virtual 5K! Thanks to these funds, we were able to meet Westwind's most dire needs to keep the camp open and operational with long-term survival as the goal. The impacts of the crisis were difficult and long-standing, with multiple rounds of staff furloughs, hours reductions, and camp maintenance at a standstill for many months. We certainly could not have survived the year without the generous and kind support of our network of donors, camp families and friends who gave during a difficult time for all of us. It is because we all share a love for Westwind - the landscape, the camp, the programs, and it's people that we have made it to today! .
